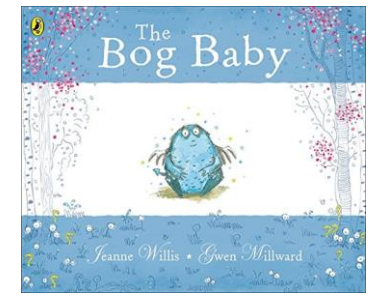


Eling Infant School Knowledge Organiser: The Bog Baby
